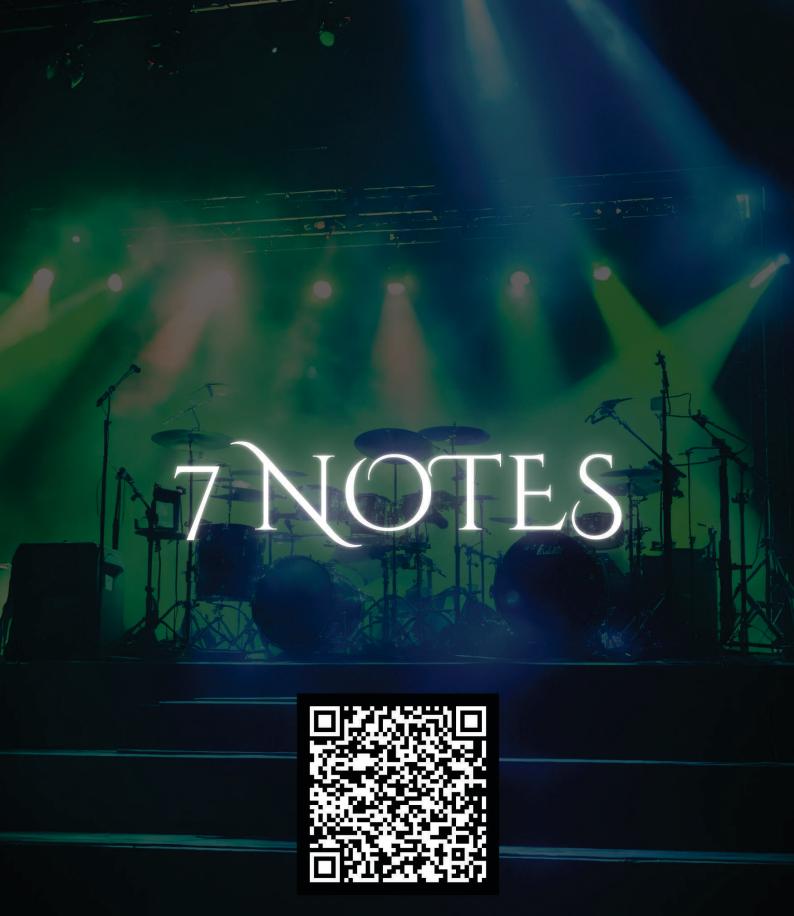

1. SOLO SINGING

The Solo Singing Competition has two rounds: preliminaries and finals. In the prelims, participants perform a 2-3 minute piece, accompanied by either a backing track or one instrumentalist. Top performers advance to the finals, where they have 4-5 minutes to showcase their vocal talent with karaoke or up to two instrumentalists. Judges' decisions are final, and online registration is required.

2. GROUP SINGING

The Group Singing competition allows teams of up to 4 members to perform together, with a performance duration of 3-5 minutes. Participants may use a backing track or be accompanied by up to two instrumentalists. Registration can be completed online, and judges will evaluate performances based on creativity and execution. The decision of the judges is final, ensuring a competitive yet supportive environment for all teams.

3. SOLO INSTRUMENTAL

In the Solo Instrumental event, musicians perform for 4-5 minutes with a setup and sound check time of 5 minutes. Participants are responsible for their own instruments, as none will be provided. The competition aims to showcase individual talent without vulgarity, with a final judgment made by the panel of judges. Registration can be done online or on-site, offering flexibility for participants.

4. FUSION BAND

The Fusion Band event invites teams of up to 8 members to showcase their musical talents through original compositions that blend various genres. Each performance has a strict time limit of 10 minutes, including a sound check of up to 10 minutes. The emphasis is on creativity and innovation in combining different musical styles and rhythms, with no backing tracks or vocal filtering allowed. Judges will assess the originality of the compositions and the successful amalgamation of diverse beats.

1. PHOTOGRAPHY COMPETITION

The Photography Competition invites participants to capture the essence of celebration through the theme "Nature's Art." Entrants must submit photographs taken after the theme announcement, with a maximum of two entries allowed. All submissions require RAW files alongside edited versions, and only basic editing is permitted. The competition encourages originality and storytelling through imagery, with awards for the top entries.

2. PHOTO ESSAY COMPETITION

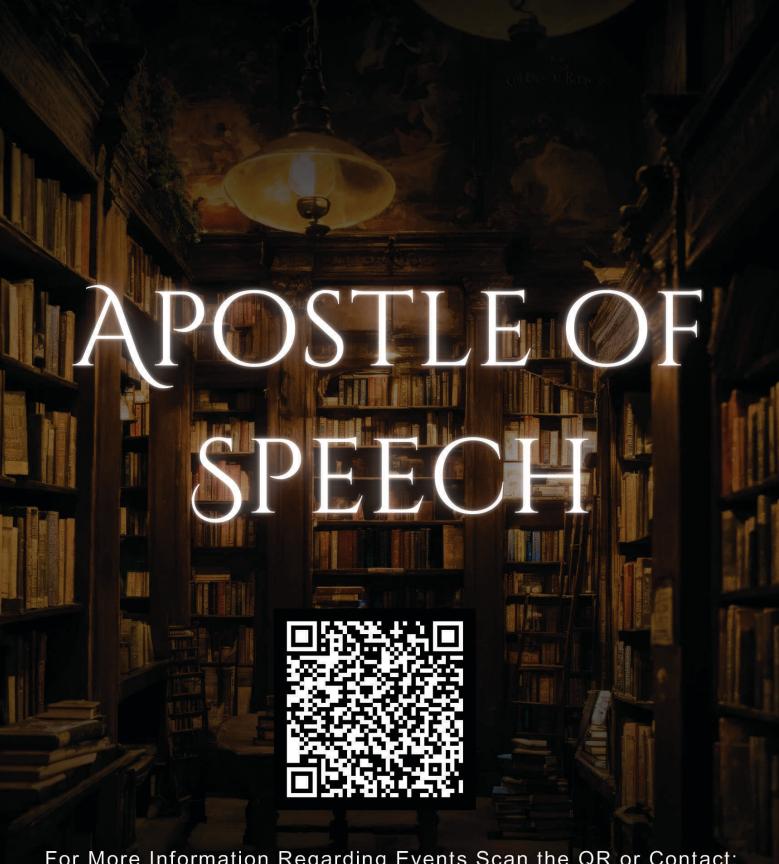
The Photo Essay Competition offers participants the chance to tell a powerful story through a series of 5-10 photographs, accompanied by captions or a narrative. This event encourages creative themes, whether related to social issues, nature, or cultural perspectives. Judging will focus on content quality and grammar, with medals or trophies awarded to the top three entries, making this a rewarding creative challenge.

3. PHOTO HUNT

In the Photo Hunt competition, teams of two must solve clues delivered via QR codes and capture photographs of the items found. Teams must stay together and cannot seek external help or use vehicles during the event. The competition emphasizes quality and speed, rewarding teams that solve the most clues effectively. Judging criteria include creativity, photo quality, and the number of clues successfully found, with prizes awarded for top placements.

4.SHORT VIDEO COMPETITION

Participants in the Short Video Competition are tasked with creating a compelling story within a time frame of 2 to 5 minutes. The competition permits the use of any filming equipment, and entries must maintain a resolution of at least 720p. Participants are encouraged to use their creativity and innovation in storytelling, with judging criteria focusing on editing, cinematography, and sound design. Raw footage must accompany the final submission.

1. CONVENTIONAL DEBATE

The Conventional Debate event involves individual participation, with topics revealed on the spot. Each participant has 10 minutes to prepare and must adhere to a strict time limit of 5 minutes and 20 seconds for their speeches. The debate format includes a proposition and opposition with opportunities for points of information. Participants are judged on content relevance, convincing ability, and overall presentation style, fostering a robust debate environment.

2. SHORT STORY WRITING

In the Short Story Writing event, participants have one hour to craft a unique story based on a topic revealed at the beginning of the competition. With a word limit of 500 words, participants are provided with stationary and must maintain originality. A surprise twist will be announced midway through the event, adding an element of unpredictability and challenge to the writing process.

3. OPEN MIC

The Open Mic event allows participants to showcase their talents in a performance lasting up to 3 minutes. Performances can include stand-up comedy or monologues in English, Hindi, or Punjabi. Participants will be evaluated on confidence, clarity, originality, and presentation manner. This platform provides a creative outlet for performers to express themselves in a supportive atmosphere.

4. TURNCOAT

The Turncoat competition challenges participants to argue for and against a topic revealed at the start of the event. Each speaker receives 2 minutes for preparation and must present for 3 minutes, alternating between positions upon cue. Participants are judged on their ability to switch sides seamlessly while maintaining coherence and clarity in their speech. This format tests quick thinking and persuasive skills in an engaging manner.

5. PICTIONARY

In Pictionary, teams of three compete to guess words illustrated by a designated member within one minute. The event fosters creativity and teamwork while prohibiting the use of numbers, letters, or symbols. Judging is based on the number of correct guesses and the quality of drawings, adding an element of fun and strategy.

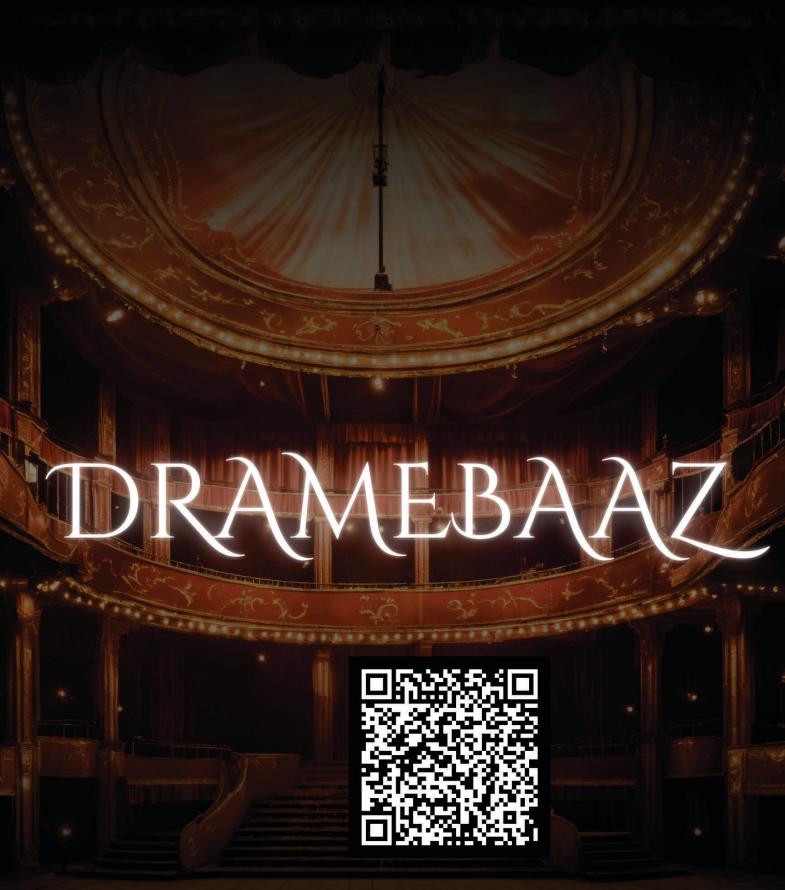

1. NUKKAD NATAK

1. BYTE BRAWL
